user guide

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how to play

Setting up the game

Put the playing board on the table and then put the bed, pillow, blanket and cat on it. Mix the 24 photo cards and stack them in a pile in the middle of the table. For game 1, the dice is not required.

How to play

Game 1

The youngest player goes first. He or she picks up a card and looks at it for a set amount of time and then puts the card face down on the table. The player then tries to recreate the scene. If the card has been recreated correctly then the player gets to keep the card. If the player has not recreated the scene properly then the card is placed at the bottom of the pile and the player on the left takes his or her turn. The first person to collect four photo cards is the winner.

Game 2

The youngest player throws the dice, and plays the corresponding game as shown on the dice. There are 3 games in total. Play goes clockwise and the other players do the same.

Bed:

The youngest player takes the board with the bed, cat, blanket and pillow and puts it in front of him or herself. The person on the left takes a photo card and shows it to the player. He or she then asks twice (slowly): "Where is our Monty?" He or she then immediately puts the photo card face down on the table. The player must now recreate the picture on the card. When the player is finished, he or she must turn the card over and compare it with what has been built. If the scene matches the card, the player keeps the card.

Headstand:

The game is played the same way as "Bed." The only difference is that the player on the left holds the card upside down when showing it to the player.

Mouth:

Choose a player to build for you. Take a photo card yourself and look at it. No other player should see the card. All players (slowly) ask twice: "Where is our Monty?" Then you must immediately put the card face down on the table. You now have to describe to the selected player exactly where Monty and the objects are, from memory. Then you can compare the recreated situation with the card. If the player builds the scene correctly, you can keep the card.

Game 3

For a more challenging game, older players can describe the scene on the card with his or her eyes closed, using words only, without the help of any gestures.

How to win

The first person to collect four photo cards is the winner. When five people are playing, the winner is the first person to collect three cards.

Notes

The most important thing is the general position of the objects and the cat. For example, it doesn't matter if the pillow is slanted the exact same way as it is in the photo, or what direction the cat is looking in. Younger children can point a bit when they are describing but they cannot touch anything.
